CITY OF HILLS AND DALES, KENTUCKY Ordinance 2005-4

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO PARKING OF COMMERCIAL VEHICLES

Be it ordained by the City of Hills and Dales, Kentucky, that parking a commercial vehicle on any residential property or on any street in the City or in the common areas in the City, except in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance, is prohibited.

Section 1. No commercial-type vehicle shall be parked or stored on any residential property or on any street or in the common areas in the City.

As used herein "commercial-type vehicle" means a motor vehicle meeting any one or more of the following classifications: a. exceeding 22 feet in length and typically used for the transport of goods and materials for commercial purposes; b. having a design load carrying capacity of over one ton; c. having dual rear wheels; or e. designed to carry more than twelve (12) passengers, including driver.

Section 2. Notwithstanding the provisions of the foregoing section, nothing contained herein shall prohibit the temporary parking, for reasonable periods of time, on a legal driveway or street, any commercial vehicle being used in connection with improvements to or maintenance of the residence during such periods of construction or maintenance or for the purposes of loading or unloading persons or property.

Section 3. Notwithstanding the provisions of the foregoing sections to the contrary, the parking of any commercial vehicle remains subject to regulation of parking established pursuant to the Louisville Metro government or state traffic and zoning regulations.

Section 4. Violation of any provision of this Ordinance will result in a written warning notice upon the first violation. If the violation continues more than 10 days from the date of the written warning, the offender will be cited for the violation of this Ordinance and fined \$75 for each separate offense. A separate offense shall be deemed committed on each day during or on which a violation occurs or continues.

Section 5. Any unpaid fine imposed shall constitute a lien upon the real estate.

Section 6. This Ordinance may be enforced pursuant to KRS 83A.065.

Section 7. This Ordinance shall take effect after its passage, signing and publication as required by law.
